

# Rob Lowe Launches Town Meetings To Help Cancer Patients And Their Loved Ones Understand Chemotherapy And its Side Effects

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#### New Survey Finds Most Patients Want To Treat Cancer Aggressively But Also Fear the Side Effects of Chemotherapy

NEW YORK, March 3, 2003 - Rob Lowe, national spokesperson for *By My Side<sup>TM</sup>: Taking Charge of Cancer Treatment*, foday announced the introduction of educational Town Meetings which will roll out across the country to help cancer patients and their loved ones understand chemotherapy, its side effects and how to make informed decisions about their cancer treatment.

In a new survey of 301 cancer chemotherapy patients, 89 percent reported that they feel the best way to overcome cancer is to treat it aggressively and take control of their treatment. However, 62 percent of the patients surveyed believe that some of the side effects of chemotherapy can be as life-threatening as the cancer itself.

Created by The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, Cancer Care and biotechnology company Amgen, the town meetings were developed in response to the survey's finding that 71 percent of patients were so overwhelmed by their initial diagnosis of cancer that they were unable to absorb information about their cancer and its treatment.

"This is especially important given recent medical research, which has shown that treating certain cancers more aggressively can result in better survival outcomes," said Diane Blum, Executive Director of Cancer Care. "If patients are too scared of chemotherapy side effects, they may not get optimum treatment and might not give themselves the best chance of recovery."

Lowe will join medical oncologist Robert Livingston from the Seattle Cancer Care Alliance, oncology social worker and Associate Executive Director of Cancer Care Ellen Coleman, oncology nurse Susan Leigh associated with U.S. Oncology, and a cancer survivor in a special online broadcast to launch the Town Meeting series. The broadcast, produced by HealthTalk Interactive, will be held on March 4th at 8:30 P.M. ET and will discuss the common side effects experienced by many cancer patients undergoing chemotherapy, including those that can be serious or potentially life-threatening. The Improving the Chemotherapy Experience TMTown Meetings are the latest resource from the ongoing By My Side TMTown Was created to raise awareness about potentially life-threatening chemotherapy-related infection and other chemotherapy side effects.

"When my dad was diagnosed with cancer, we could have benefited from an educational program like *By My Side™*. Chemotherapy saves lives, but it also can lead to side effects like infection, anemia, nausea and vomiting, some of which may be serious or potentially life-threatening. For example, my dad developed an infection that forced him to stop his chemotherapy for a while," said Lowe. "Today, there are things you can do to help protect yourself from serious side effects like infection. Listening to physicians and other cancer patients at these Town Meetings may help give patients the information and courage to take charge of their cancer treatment."

The virtual meeting will be followed by similar live meetings in local communities around the country. These free events will be hosted by preeminent oncology experts, nurses and patients who will discuss the experience of being diagnosed with cancer, how to prepare for chemotherapy and how to manage both the emotional and physical side effects.

"Hearing a diagnosis of cancer is so shocking and overwhelming that the majority of patients are unable to clearly recall the conversation with their doctors or healthcare professionals," said Robin Kornhaber, Senior Vice President of Patient Services at The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society. "This program was created to give cancer patients access to treatment information, as well as a forum for asking questions that they need answered. We want to help them get through this difficult time."

New cancer research is underway everyday and patients want to stay informed. Through the *By My Side™*Town Meetings and other information made available through various advocacy groups like The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society and Cancer Care, patients can stay abreast of new developments and how they may impact treatment options.

family was unaware that infection was a serious risk associated with chemotherapy, or that having an infection would force Chuck to temporarily stop his cancer treatment, potentially jeopardizing his chances for success. Infections can also land patients in the hospital, which may expose them to additional infections and take them away from the support and love of their families and friends.
