Four Outstanding Teachers Will Be Recognized in Puerto Rico

This award is designed to recognize and honor extraordinary science teachers, grades K-12 in communities where Amgen operates, who significantly impact their students through exemplary science teaching and who achieve demonstrated results in student learning.

A longstanding leader in commitment to science education, Amgen established the teacher awards program to promote and encourage science excellence in public and private schools. - Recognition at an awards banquet and within Amgen corporate materials;
- Access to a forum for sharing best practices with other Amgen award winners from around Puerto Rico and the U.S.

A panel of independent judges will select the winners based on the following criteria: creativity of teaching method; effectiveness in the classroom; motivational ability; instructional ability; and the plan for the use of grant money to improve science education resources in their schools.
